Three movements in ministry - Henri Nouwen from temptation to vocation

- From Relevance to Prayer
 - The temptation to be relevant 'turn stones into bread'
 - "Do You Love Me?"
 - The prayer Contemplative Prayer
- From Popularity to Ministry -
 - The temptation to be spectacular throw yourself from the pinnacle of the temple
 - "Feed My Sheep"
 - The prayer Confession and forgiveness
- From Leading to Being Led
 - The temptation to be powerful have power over all these kingdoms
 - "Somebody Else Will Take You"
 - The prayer theological reflection discernment

Five approaches to prayer in ministry:

Prayer of the Office – Communal faithfulness

Prayer of intercession – Global need – bringing the needs of the world to the foot of the cross

Prayer of Confession and forgiveness – own one's own and other's fallibility – depending on God's grace

Prayer of Silent Contemplation – utter God centredness – intention that nothing gets in the way of our attention to God

Prayer of Discernment – finding God in all things

Four movements of discernment

- I. **Desire for God** and for God to be the centre
- 2. **Need for freedom** from 'attachments' (that which draws us away from God) to have 'indifference' in order to respond to God's movement/call
- 3. Recognition of the tension in the particular
- 4. **Choosing life** over death, freedom over slavery moving with the fruit of the Spirit

Six steps in the prayer of Discernment - The Examen of Consciousness (Review of the Day)

- I. Ask for God's perspective
- 2. Look back for the life giving
- 3. Give thanks
- 4. Look back for the life draining
- 5. Seek light and grace
- 6. Look ahead ask for what you need
